# Help Central 2-1-1: One Number, One Easy Way to Find Help

For students and residents alike, finding lowcost or no-cost assistance has never been easier, thanks to Help Central 2-1-1. The mission of Help Central is to connect people in need with services that offer help. This local nonprofit organization was established to facilitate and improve public access to essential health and human services. They work with partner agencies to create a caring community that links individuals and families to the support services they need. By giving accurate information and connecting people to resources, they help strengthen families and our communities.

Help Central provides three ways that students and residents of Butte and Glenn counties can receive immediate information and support.

1- Call the 2-1-1 helpline 24 hours/day for live help

2- Text your zip code to 898211 for live help 3- Search the free public

database at HelpCentral.org (211glenn.info or Butte211.org)

The HelpCentral.org website provides a way

to quickly find lowcost and no-cost health and human services in Butte and Glenn counties. This free online resource can be accessed 24 hours a day, seven days a week by any Internet user. You can search for specific services, or browse categories to find information.

Butte-Glenn 211 is working with county and state partners to provide accurate public health information and to connect residents with local resources. For live response, dial 2-1-1 or text your zip code to 898211 or visit the COVID19 website 211buttecovid.org.

Because of COVID-19, information and access to resources is changing rapidly as many social service agencies and their workers are following the stay at home order. Some services may now not be available in person, but may be accessed by phone or online. Butte-Glenn 211 is doing their best to track these changes and updates in real time. Always call ahead before visiting an essential services location.

tudents who are victims of sexual assault, intimate partner violence or stalking don't have to suffer in silence, thanks to robust support programs offered at both CSU, Chico and Butte College. The Wellcat Safe Place at CSU, and the Safe Place & Wellness Program at Butte College offer support and advocacy services for those in need. The following is a general overview of servic-

### Wellcat Safe Place at CSU, Chico:

WellCat Safe Place provides confidential support services to individuals impacted by traumatic experiences. We strive to restore one's belonging while collaborating to build an equitable culture through empathy and empowerment. Starting in Fall, 2021, services will be available both in person and online.

#### How Safe Place Can Help

Wellcat Safe Place services are confidential and available for all students, faculty, and staff at CSU, Chico. Call 530-898-3030 or stop by the office in the Student Services Center 180. You may also email safeplace@csuchico.edu. Appointments are confidential, and an advocate is able to provide you options on Title IX, law enforcement, safety, and medical care.

Crisis Support

A Confidential advocate is available to listen, believe, and validate. Staff is available to provide information, crisis intervention, and emotional support.

#### Accompaniment

An advocate can accompany you to the hospital, Student Health Center, law enforcement interview, Title IX meetings, or any other appointments related to interpersonal violence.

Advocacy

Advocates can assist in obtaining a Restraining Order, creating a safety plan, and help to remove barriers that may exist in accessing other services.

#### Accommodations

Assistance in getting academic, scheduling, and/or housing accommodations if you are feeling unsafe on campus, or you are having trouble focusing in class due to interpersonal violence.

Educational Programming

- Provide outreach activities to students, staff, and faculty on campus.
- Deliver classroom presentations on healthy relationships and affirmative consent.
